ABOUT THE COLLEGE

PCC offers general and technical education programs that meet the diverse needs of south central Kansas. Situated on 80-acres, the campus facilities include the main building, six residence halls, two technical buildings, the Electric Power Technology Center, Chandler School of Nursing and Allied Health, an indoor rodeo arena, a student center, and indoor baseball/softball practice buildings. In addition, the campus has an outdoor rodeo arena, soccer field, and a lighted baseball field. The college was gifted a 229 acre farm, ranch, and rodeo facility six miles north of the main campus. Currently the facility is utilized for hands on training for agriculture students.
