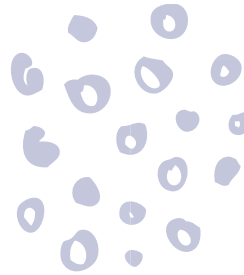


# RESIDENCE LIFE AT PCC

# BE A PCC BEAVER AT NO COST THROUGH THE KANSAS PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP



APPLICATION AVAILABLE NOW!

## KANSAS PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP FUND SPECIFICS:

1. Last dollar scholarship which applies after all other federal aid and any outside scholarships are subtracted from the student's bill.
2. Pays for tuition, fees, books, and supplies for up to an associate degree. Allows the student to attend community college without cost except for any room and board costs they may incur.
3. \$10,000,000 across the state available and has been already appropriated for FY 22 and FY 23 to fund the program.
4. This scholarship may be used for up to a per student lifetime total of 68 credit hours or \$20,000, whichever occurs first, in one or more of these eligible programs.

## ELIGIBLE STUDENTS/ INCOME LIMITS:

For students to be eligible for a service scholarship, they must:

- Be a United States citizen and Kansas resident; AND
- Have graduated from a secondary school within the preceding 12 months or have attended a secondary school and obtained an equivalent credential within the preceding 12 months; OR
- Be Kansas resident for the preceding three consecutive years; OR
- Be a dependent child of a military servicemember permanently stationed in another state and who, within the preceding 12 months, graduated from any out-of-state secondary school or obtained a high school equivalency; OR
- Was in the custody of the KS Department of Children and Families at any time during grades 9-12.

To be eligible, students must have a family household income of:

- \$100,000 or less for a family of two;
- \$150,000 or less for a family of three; and
- \$150,000 + \$4,800 per additional family member beyond three.

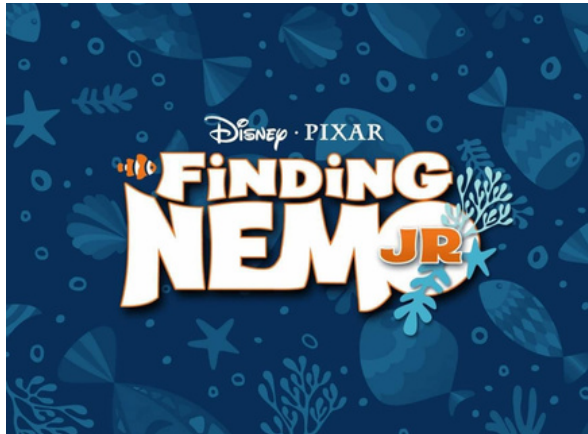
## STUDENT OBLIGATIONS FOR ACCEPTING A KANSAS PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP:

1. Complete the [FAFSA](#), AND
2. Complete the Kansas Promise Scholarship Application at [Complete the FAFSA](#).
3. Complete the Kansas Promise Scholarship Application
4. Enter into an agreement to live **AND** work in Kansas for two years post certificate or degree completion. Can delay the obligation if pursuing a bachelor's degree. If the student fails to fulfill scholarship requirements the amount of the scholarship must be paid back plus interest.
5. Maintain satisfactory academic progress (SAP) and complete program of study within 30 months of first receiving the Kansas Promise Scholarship.
6. Enroll in an eligible field of study, **AND**
7. Enter into an agreement to live **AND** work in Kansas for two years post certificate or degree completion. Can delay the obligation if pursuing a Bachelor's Degree. If the student fails to fulfill scholarship requirements, the amount of the scholarship must be paid back plus interest.
8. Complete and submit the Kansas Promise Scholarship Renewal application [and the FAFSA] for any academic year(s) following the initial award for which you wish to continue receiving the Promise Scholarship for your Promise-Eligible Program; **AND**
9. Maintain satisfactory academic progress (SAP) and complete program of study within 36 months of first receiving the Kansas Promise Scholarship.

- AN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCESSING FEE OF \$100 WILL BE CHARGED AFTER AUGUST 1 IF STUDENTS HAVE NOT COMPLETED THEIR SCHOLARSHIP, LETTER OF INTENT OR CONFIRMED PAYMENT PLAN WITH THE BUSINESS OFFICE.
