

Selection Criteria

The Pratt Community College Selection Criteria is 100% performance outcome based.

You as the applicant determine your potential for selection. The higher Overall College GPA, the higher ATI TEAS® score, the better Performance Reference score the better your opportunity for selection.

The selection criterion consists of:

- TEAS Overall Individual Adjusted Score
 - The Overall Individual Adjusted score Minimum of 58.7% (contributes a minimum of 58.7 points)
 - To qualify there must be a minimum of 50% scored on the Science section for your overall score to be included in the selection consideration (Score of 60% contributes a bonus of 5 points)
 - Additionally, there must be a minimum of 65% scored on the Reading section for your overall score to be included in the selection consideration (Score of 75% contributes a bonus of 5 points)
- Reference Performance Appraisal Score
 - Total score ranges between 0 to 10 available (contributes a minimum of 5 points)
- Minimums required include
 - Minimum 2.5 OVERALL GPA REQUIRED (contributes a minimum of 25 points)
 - Minimum 3.0 REQUIRED for Microbiology and Anatomy & Physiology
 - Minimum 58.7% ATI TEAS OVERALL Individual Adjusted Score REQUIRED
 - Minimum 50% ATI TEAS Science Score REQUIRED
 - Minimum 65% ATI TEAS Reading Score REQUIRED
 - 2 Reference Performance Appraisals REQUIRED (contributes a maximum of 10 points)
 - **Minimum selection score of 90 points REQUIRED to be considered for selection consideration**
- Bonus points:
 - 10 bonus points for a grade of 4.0 (A) on Anatomy & Physiology (5 credit hour)
 - 5 bonus points for an ATI TEAS® Science Score that exceeds 60
 - 5 bonus points for an ATI TEAS® Reading Score that exceeds 75
 - 5 bonus points for an ATI TEAS® Math Score that exceeds 80

Selection Score Example:

Required Prerequisite GPA = 25 (minimum) + Overall ATI TEAS® score = 60 + Reference Performance Appraisal score of 10 maximum + Bonus points = 25 (maximum) provides a COMPOSITE SELECTION SCORE OF: 120

Each class has an established maximum number of students. Example: a class with an established maximum of 20 students would be composed of the 20 applicants with the highest overall composite selection scores, which had met all admissions requirements. An additional 3 to 5 applicants, if qualified, may be identified as "alternates", for each program cohort.
