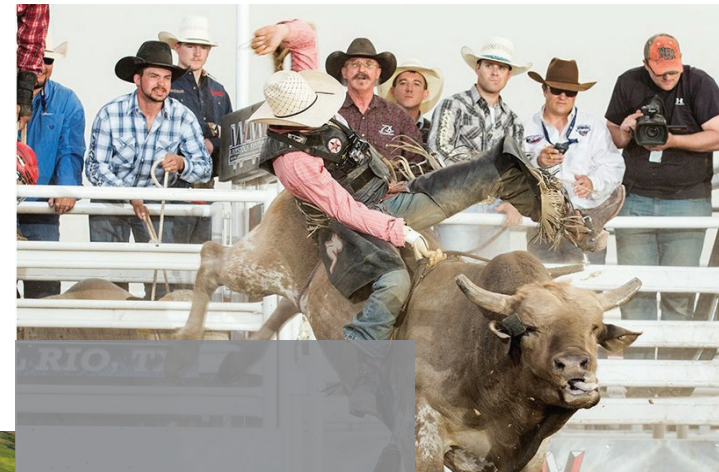

RODEO



The PCC Rodeo program has a legacy that runs long and deep in the Central Plains Region of NIRA. The team can practice year round with our indoor and outdoor arenas.

- Pratt Community College rodeo is a member of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA). Pratt is located in the Central Plains Region which is one of the 11 regions throughout the United States. The NIRA allows men to compete in; Bull Riding, Saddle Bronc, Bareback, Team Roping, Steer Wrestling and Tie Down Roping. The women can compete in Barrels, Breakaway, Goat Tying and Team Roping. Each team is eligible to compose a points team of four women and six men. With the top three individuals in each event and the top two teams in the region to qualify for the College National Finals Rodeo.

Both indoor and outdoor facilities are located on Pratt's 80 acre campus within walking distance of all dormitories. The facilities are accompanied by three stall barns with runs. Practice calves, steers and goats are provided along with the opportunity to ride practice pen bulls and broncs. Several other practice tools are available to work on technique and timing on your own.
