D. DOE Raise the Bar Recognition Program – Dr. Michael Calvert, President

The direction of the new Postsecondary Success Recognition Program from the U.S. Department of Education (ED) is to uplift schools that embrace this new vision of college excellence and to inspire similar efforts by other institutions given the urgent need to increase completion rates and close completion gaps in this country.

Schools must meet the definition of an institution of higher education in the Higher Education Act. Institutions are classified by their predominant undergraduate credential awarded in the eligibility universe using a variable derived from IPEDS in the College Scorecard dataset rather than as two-year or four-year institutions.

Institutions must be current participants in Federal Title IV programs. Some institutions are excluded due to data availability. Institutions must be accredited and in good standing with their accrediting agency. Criteria was applied to ensure the eligibility universe reflected the goals of the program to focus on inclusive institutions.

Pratt Community College has been named by the U.S. Department of Education as one of the 100 community college nation-wide recipients of the Raise the Bar award. This is a result of the quality work and student focus demonstrated by everyone at PCC. Next step is to complete the application questions and submitted by November 1, 2024.

Financial Report – Kent Adams, VP Finance and Operations

Revenue is \$726K favorable in September. This compares to \$673 favorable in August. Tuition is over budget \$145K due to EDUKAN enrollment. The first half of the state operating grant was received as budgeted. Miscellaneous revenue is over budget \$548K due to EDUKAN final payout of \$296K and payment plan charges of \$162K

Expenditures are \$110K under budget in September. This compares to \$177K under budget in August.

Students assessed the biological communities of the river by sampling fish using electroshocking techniques and collecting macroinvertebrates with dip nets. Also conducted a habitat survey and performed basic water chemistry tests to assess the overall condition of the river.
