Total funds raised for student scholarships were \$101,501, which far exceeded the goal of \$90,000!

PCC entered into a partnership with Barton CC, which allowed for BCC to begin facilitating the Associate Degree of Nursing (ADN) program on the Pratt campus in Fall 2022. A potential partnership to also offer the LPN program in partnership with BCC on the Pratt campus is in progress with the Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN).



Jamaira Ross Breaks Women's 5K Record

Freshman Jamaira Ross had a record-breaking afternoon in Fayetteville, AR at the 34th Annual Chile Pepper Festival in September. She finished in 30th place in the 5K with a time of 19:20.5, breaking the school record. Then in November at the National Junior College Athletic Association Cross Country and Half Marathon Championship in Tallahassee, FL Jamaira broke her own new record in the 5K, placing 17th in the race with a time of 19:13:60.





Multiple PCC Teams Earn Academic Honors

The Wrestling team was named the 2021-22 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Academic Team of the Year with a team grade point average of 3.49. PCC teams also recognized for academic excellence include Baseball (3.16 GPA), Women's Basketball (3.32 GPA), Women's Soccer (3.28 GPA), Men's Tennis (3.46 GPA), Softball (3.19 GPA) and Volleyball (3.21 GPA).
