



Faculty Spotlight

MR. PHILLIP "DAVE" CAMPBELL



ELECTRICAL POWER TECHNOLOGY INSTRUCTOR

Dave kicked off his adventure as a limeman back in '69 when he was just 18 years young! Back then, there were no fancy classrooms or formal training. You rolled up your sleeves and learned the ropes right on the job!

During the Vietnam War, rather than being drafted, Dave chose to enlist in the National Guard to fulfill his military service. He was involved in field work for an artillery unit, which closely resembled line work.

Dave has been a part of PCC since October 2008. This past fall, he participated in the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new EPT building. Additionally, he has been honored with the Teacher of the Year award!

BEAVER WRESTLING BEGINS QUEST FOR FIFTH STRAIGHT KJCCC CHAMPIONSHIP



The Number nine ranked Pratt
Community College wrestling team will
begin their quest for a fifth straight
Kansas Jayhawk Community College
Conference title on Wednesday,
January 15, as they travel to Parson,
Kan., to face the No. 13 Labette
Community College and the No. 22
Cloud County Community College.

Pratt will wrestle Cloud County first at 3:00 p.m. and then Labette at 6:00 p.m. The Beavers finished their non-conference tournament schedule at the 2025 Jet Open on Saturday, Jan. 4, in Wichita, Kan. Freshman Donley finished first in the 125-pound weight class while both Juarez at 174 pounds and Bankston at 285 pounds won second place. Third-place finishers included Agnew at 133 pounds, Powe at 165 pounds, and Gonzalez at 285 pounds. Wrapping up the results for Pratt, Field was 149 pounds and Bahm at 157 pounds, finishing in fourth place.

Currently, the Beavers have four wrestlers nationally ranked in their respective weight classes. They include Donely at 125 pounds, Thomas at 157 pounds, Bankston at 285 pounds, and Powe at 165 pounds, with Powe ranked No. One.

The Cloud County Community College T-Birds enter the dual currently ranked No. 22 in the nation and were in action this past weekend, January 10-11, at the NJCAA Coaches Association Duals. The T-Birds faced off against five community colleges and went 0-5 on the weekend. They wrestled Northern Oklahoma College-Tonkawa (11-42), Northwest College (3-50), No. Three Clackamas Community College (0-48), No. Seven Triton College (24-36) and Big Bend Community College (16-42). The only ranked wrestler for the T-Birds is Chambers at 174 pounds.



ESPORTS ADDING ROCKET LEAGUE TEAM IN 2025



The Pratt Community College
Esports team is adding a Rocket
League team to the program's list
of games. The team currently has
two Overwatch 2 teams, Valorant
and Fortnite teams. This will be the
first time since 2022 that the
program has fielded an entire 3v3
Rocket League team.

"I was approached back in September by one of the recruiters I work with in Brazil about the potential of adding a Rocket League team in the spring as he had three top-level players looking for an opportunity to play in America," said head Esports coach Charles Keefer. "We had a Rocket League team compete in one tournament during my first semester as a coach, but quickly disbanded due to a lack of interest by players. I am excited to rebuild this roster with talented players."

The first member of the roster is Silva, known to the Rocket League world as "back," who has been playing for over two years. In November 2024, Silva achieved the top 49 of the Rocket League Championship Series (RLCS) South American (SAM) open qualifier three as a substitute and coach. The team won \$300 in prize money and finished 33 in the 3v3 SAM Offseason Open. Silva has also played in several 1v1 tournaments and finished 97 and 49 in two South American tournaments. His peak rank is Grand Champion 2 (1640), and he is currently ranked Grand Champion 1 (1489) in 3v3.

The second roster member is Silveria, known as "Novaboost" on Rocket League. Vitor has over 600 hours of gameplay and has peaked at Grand Champion 2 in 3v3. In addition, Silveria has competitive experience in Overwatch 2, peaking in the Top 500 as a support player, and is currently ranked Diamond 2 in Marvel Rivals, a rank he reached in one day. Playing at Pratt Community College will be his first competitive experience in Rocket League.



PCC SOCCER ADDS A NEW FACE



Pratt Community College welcomes Aaron Grant, an alumnus, back to campus this semester as an assistant coach for the Men's and Women's Soccer Programs!

When asked about his thoughts on rejoining the PCC community, Aaron couldn't help but express his love for Pratt. Aaron was a 2-year captain with PCC (Fall 2016-Spring 2018) and loved his experiences. His wife, originally from Pratt, is also excited about moving back closer to family. Aaron's greatest hope for his time coaching for PCC is to help players have the same kind of experience that he did. He believes that working closely with his former head coach, Kevin Kewley will allow him to grow as a coach and develop his skills.

Coach Kewley's comments about the hire were very positive. "Aaron will be a great asset to the men's and women's soccer programs here at Pratt. Having coached him when he played at Pratt, I know he will greatly help everyone and fit well with the Beaver culture."

New Head Coach Brandon Jackson is excited to work with Aaron and believes he will be a great asset to the team.

Groundhog Dav


