The Month of January

Benjamin Franklin's Birthday

January 17th celebrates Benjamin Franklin, a founding father known for his diverse contributions to science, politics, and civic engagement. Renowned for his electrical experiments and inventions like the lightning rod, he also played a crucial role in drafting the Declaration of Independence. Franklin's legacy of curiosity, innovation, and diplomacy inspires many today.





Martin Luther King Jr. Day is celebrated on the third Monday of January to honor Dr. King's contributions to the civil rights movement through nonviolent advocacy. His "I Have a Dream" speech is pivotal in the struggle for racial justice. The day reminds us of his lasting influence and encourages community service and social justice efforts, aligning with his vision of an equitable world.

Presidential Inauguration

Inauguration Day occurs every four years on January 20. The inauguration ceremony takes place at the U.S. Capitol building in Washington, DC. The vice president-elect is sworn in first and repeats the same oath of office that has been used since 1884 by senators, representatives, and other federal employees. Around noon, the president-elect recites an oath by Article II, Section I of the U.S. Constitution.



Athletic Director Larry Johnston shared some thoughts on his new hire, saying, "Brandon will be a great cultural fit for PCC Athletics. His experience as a player and coach at the college and university level will be a great asset to the PCC women's soccer program."

Brandon Jackson comes to Pratt Community College after two successful seasons as the Head Coach of Women's Soccer Coach at Garrett College (MD). During his time there, he was able to start their first-ever women's soccer program. In just two years, he finished in the top four in the region and got six players nominated to the all-region team.

"I am incredibly grateful and excited for the opportunity to lead the women's soccer program at Pratt Community College. I am ready to compete in the powerhouse Jayhawk Conference and help move the program back to its winning ways," says Jackson.

Jackson, an Indiana native, started his collegiate athletic career at Taylor University (IN). I was voted as a freshman All-American selection while at Taylor University. Jackson then transferred to Pearl River Community College (MS) for his Sophomore season. Jackson was voted Male Student-Athlete of the Year at Pearl River. Jackson concluded his final two years of college playing at Lindenwood University (IL). Jackson was a two-year starter at Lindenwood. While attending Lindenwood, Jackson earned his Bachelor's Degree in Business and Master's in education.

Jackson said, "I believe college athletics can instill core values in the individual, enhance students' success in the classroom, and develop the athlete at the next level. I want to create an environment of winning excellence that fosters student-athletes winning on and off the field."

In a matchup between Fort Hays Tech Northwest and Pratt Community College on December 11, 2024, Pratt Community College emerged victorious with a final score of 65-57. The game was closely contested throughout, with Pratt Community College holding onto a lead each quarter to secure the win.

Of the two teams, Pratt Community College had a more efficient shooting night, finishing with a field goal percentage of 35.7% and a free throw percentage of 60.0%. The Beavers' ability to hit free throws throughout the game was a key to their victory, as Fort Hays Tech Northwest was called for 26 personal fouls.

Johnson led the way for the Beavers with 21 points and 14 rebounds, while Dana Imankulova added 14 points. Freshman Humphry was the second Beaver of the night to finish with a double-double with 12 points and 15 rebounds. Finally, Pratt outrebounded the Tigers 53-31.

On the other hand, Fort Hays Tech Northwest struggled with shooting, shooting 35.3% from the field and 13.3% from beyond the arc. Brown, coming off the bench for the Tig, was a standout performer, leading the team with 21 points and 12 rebounds.

BEAVERS OPEN UP 2025 WITH ROAD TRIP TO COFFEYVILLE



The Pratt Community College men's and women's basketball teams return to action this evening, Wednesday, Jan. 8 for the first time since December 14. Both teams will face the Red Ravens of Coffeyville Community College on the road in Coffeyville, Kan.

The women's team finished their fall 2024 schedule with an overall record of 6-7 and a conference record of 1-6. The team's only conference win came against Fort Hays Tech Northwest on December 11, 65-57. Freshman Johnson leads the team with 13.5 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per game heading into the new year.

The Red Ravens enter the contest with an overall record of 10-3 and 5-3 in conference play. Coffeyville has defeated Fort Hays Tech Northwest, Colby Community College, Independence, Garden City Community College, and Cowley College. They opened their spring 2025 schedule with a loss at Butler Community College. Sophomores Welch and Washington are the players to watch. Welch averages 11.4 points per game, while Washington averages 11.2 points and 9.2 rebounds.

On the men's side, the Beavers finished 2024 with a three-game winning streak against Barton Community College, Fort Hays Tech Northwest, and Colby Community College. They entered the holiday break with an 8-5 overall and a 4-3 conference record. Sophomores Dingle, Robinson, Vaughn, and Opareke average over ten points per game for the Beavers. Opareke leads the team with 7.4 rebounds per game.

The 11-3 Coffeyville Red Ravens are currently ranked No. 23 in the NJCAA poll and have a 7-1 conference record. The team's only conference loss was against Cowley College on December 14. Coffeyville picked up its first New Year win on January 4 against Butler Community College. Both Taylor and Griffith average 14 points per game, with the team averaging 81.4 points a game.

The Beavers will next host Hutchinson Community College on Saturday, January 11, at 2:00 and 4:00 p.m.
