
### PRIDE MONTH

- President Bill Clinton was the first U.S. president to formally acknowledge Pride Month in 1999.
- Pride Month features a variety of activities such as parades, workshops, and concerts to advocate for LGBTQ+ visibility and rights.
- Pride Month is embraced worldwide, celebrated in countries spanning across all continents, from the U.S. to South Africa to Japan.

#### Four Baseball Players Honored with All-Conference Awards

The Pratt Community College baseball team wrapped up their season a few weeks ago in the opening round of the NJCAA Plains District tournament facing the Caveliers of Johnson County Community College on May 2-3. The Beavers lost the three-game series 2-0 with losses of 8-5 and 9-2. The Beavers finished their season with an overall record of 22-35 with a conference record of 7-25 with a team batting average of .297 with 37 homeruns.

Four players were named to the All-KJCCC Baseball West Division teams. Ben Waliczek was named to the second team and led the Beavers with a .370 batting average and 56 stolen bases. Waliczek finished the season ranked No. four nationally in stolen bases. Sophomores Drew Bugner, Gavin Djurovic, and Gavin Phippen all received honorable mentions.

Bugner led the team with 60 RBIs and had 27 stolen bases with a .332 batting average. Djurovic led the team with 71 hits with a .359 batting average and 57 RBIs. On the mound, Phippen threw 26.1 innings with a 4.78 earned run average and 29 strikeouts.

#### Joseph Michel Finished Seventh At Nationals

The Pratt Community College track and field team wrapped up their 2023-2024 season at the NJCAA DI Outdoor Track and Field Championships from May 16-18 in Monroe, La. The meet took place on the campus of the University of Louisiana Monroe.

Sophomore <u>Joseph Michel</u> finished his time in a Beaver uniform as an NJCAA All-American finishing seventh in the 100-meter dash finals. Michel finished his indoor season as an NJCAA All-American as well. It has been since 2020 since a Beaver sprinter has finished as an All-American and since 2002 since a track athlete has ended their year as a dual All-American.

The other top result on the men's side was the 4x400-meter relay team finishing eleventh with a time of three minutes and 14.78 seconds. On the women's side the 4x100-meter relay team finished eleventh.

#### Beaver Men's Tennis Finish Season at Nationals

The Pratt Community College men's tennis team wrapped up their 2023-24 season on day three of the 2024 NJCAA Men's National Championships in Plano, TX hosted by Colin College. The Beavers sit in sixth place in the rankings with 26 team points. With the championships wrapping up on Friday, May 18 the final standings will be released at that time, but Pratt is projected to finish the highest it has under the helm of head coach Jeret Johnson.

Tournament highlights include a 9-0 day one record with every advancing to round 2 with an 8-0 record after the second day. All six singles players and two of the three doubles teams advanced to the quarterfinals on Wednesday, May 15. This is the earliest time the team was eliminated from the championships, but it is the most athletes Pratt has had play in the quarterfinals.
