The summer preceeding the 2022-2023 PCC Rodeo Season was a busy one and August was no exception.



# MENTAL HEALTH MINUTE



#### **Finding Motivation**

As an adjunct instructor and a staff member in the Student Success Center, I have seen many students who appear to be lacking motivation throughout the semester. Often times, it is toward midterms. Other times it is toward the end of the semester. However, there is a sly group that begins to show that very early on. So why is motivation so important? Motivation is a part of almost everything we do. Simply getting out of bed in the morning, going to classes, doing the homework for those classes, making it to practice, etc. Motivation is the ultimate underlying factor that drives us to complete those tasks.

Neuropsychologist, Sanam Hafeez, PsyD, from Columbia University states that, "Motivation is a key activity to living a productive life. Without motivation, it is hard for people to complete important tasks, find a work-life and home-life balance, and essentially, make the most of every single day."

If that is the case, then why do we sometimes have a difficult time finding motivation? Simple. Sometimes people struggle to find that sense. It could just be a general feeling once in a while. It could be more than that. Here are some common roadblocks:

<u>Little or No Direction</u> They may feel like they are just making it through the days. If this is the case, maybe try writing out a todo list or a plan to help inspire you.

Lack of Self-Discipline Conquering a task simply by writing out a goal will not happen. Discipline is what pushes that goal into a conquered feat. One big piece that seems to be ignored in self-discipline is that it does require focusing. We simply are not meant to multitask; our focus cannot actually be divided up like that.

**Self-Doubt and/or Fear of Failure** Many people feel embarrassed, self-hatred, sad, worried, or more stressed out when they fail. While accomplishment feels amazing as an end result, it is not always a clear and smooth path. Remember that it might start out muddy and feelings may be a bit unpleasant; however, they can be processed in a healthy way. Rachel Goldman, PhD, is a licensed psychologist who says,

"Many people experience fear or feeling or thoughts related to failing, but until you try, you will never know." And sometimes, we may need to rely on the wise words of Master Yoda, "No! Try not. Do. Or do not. There is no try."

**Feeling Overwhelmed** This is probably one of the most common reasons I have heard from students – and even myself when I lack motivation. We often pile too much on our plates at one time, convinced we can do it all and multitask our way through it. However, our brains are simply -once again- not meant to multitask. When we get overwhelmed, we tend to shut down and avoid all the tasks we need to attend to. **Anxiety, Stress, and/or Depression** Sometimes people lack motivation because of an underlying -or even known- mental health battle. There are many strategies, from meditation to exercise to just talking to a friend, that can help. Additionally, we have a licensed professional counselor (that's me!) on campus to help out as well.

That may all seem a bit overwhelming to read, but there are ways to find and harness that motivation. It is never too late to bounce back when we feel unsure or even stuck.

\*\*Start by looking at habits, practices, patterns that you do. But do so without judging yourself. In order to fix anything, you have to be willing to acknowledge the issue. It can be difficult, but if you remove judgment, you can see the patterns and habits that may be blocking your motivation. \*\*Find a reason to do your tasks without expecting something in return. This is simply looking for intrinsic motivation - that inner drive that keeps us in activities just because it is rewarding in and of itself to complete. Dr. Hafeez says, "Some intrinsic motivations that drive us are curiosity, personal growth, challenges, a sense of duty and belonging, affiliations, and recognition of purpose." Anyone who has taken my General Psychology class will tell you that I have told them all to find something to be curious about in each class, even if it is a subject you absolutely do not care about...find something to learn.

If you want help looking at your habits and patterns or motivation levels, stop by the Student Success Center. Any of us are willing to sit with you and talk about those areas and help you come up with ideas and ways to bounce back.

## **September is World Alzheimer's Awareness Month**

World Alzheimer's Month is the international campaign from Alzheimer's Disease International that takes place every September.

Each September, people unite from all corners of the world to raise awareness and to challenge the stigma that persists around Alzheimer's disease and all types of dementia.

During World Alzheimer's Month, we call on everyone, from individuals to large organisations, including every Alzheimer and dementia association globally, to support World Alzheimer's Month by getting involved in some way.

As outlined in our World Alzheimer Report 2019, many people still wrongly believe that dementia is a normal aging. This alone highlights how important public awareness campaigns, like World Alzheimer's Month, are for changing perceptions and increasing existing public knowledge around dementia and Alzheimer's disease.

This year's theme, 'Know Dementia, Know Alzheimer's,' continues on from the 2021 campaign, which focused on diagnosis, the warning signs of dementia, the continued effect of COVID-19 on the global dementia community and more.

In 2022, the campaign will have a special focus on post-diagnostis support. Following recent developments and potential breakthroughs, in both dementia treatment and support, the campaign will aim to highlight the importance of support for people living with dementia and families following a diagnosis.

Join Us!

In the build up to, and on the day of, many Alzheimer and dementia associations around the world host memory walks, fundraisers, awareness raising activities and campaigns to bring attention towards those in their community that are affected by Alzheimer's disease or other types of dementia.

Since COVID-19, many associations, including ADI members, host events and activities virtually. These activities include webinars, remote memory walks and more.

Each World Alzheimer's Day, ADI releases its annual World Alzheimer Report. Like this year's campaign theme, the 2022 report will centre around post-diagnosis.

The following are findings from the 2021 Report, Chapter 5 Mood and Behaviorial Assessment:

- Psychological symptoms associated with cognitive decline can be part of the disease process but may be reactions to what is happening.
- Depression is a common symptom in early dementia.
- Behaviours such as agitation, paranoia, aggressivity, sleep disturbances usually occur well after the diagnosis of dementia is made but can be present in earlier stages.
- The term anosognosia refers to limited awareness of cognitive and functional deficits, but also to impaired awareness of emotional changes.

A large part of getting involved with Alzheimer's Awareness is to better understand the disease as more becomes known. You can view the <u>full 2021 World Alz-</u> <u>heimer Report</u> on the Alzheimer's Disease International website.

## Beavers Competitive Against Butler in the Beaver Dome



Pratt, Kan. – The Pratt Community College (PCC) Beavers opened conference play August 31st against the Grizzlies of Butler Community College (BCC). The Grizzlies came into the match receiving votes in the national poll and are the defending Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference (KJCCC) and the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Region VI champions.

The Beavers entered the match in front of a packed Beave Dome coming off a five-set thriller at Lamar Community College (LCC). The match unfortunately ended in a 3-2 loss for the Beavers. Pratt wasted no time feeding of the energy and played pretty competitive with the Grizzlies. Butler held on to win set one 25-14.

The second set was a back and forth match with Butler going on a 6-1 run late in the set which lead to a Pratt timeout. After the timeout, Butler continued their 12-4 run to win the set 25-17 and to take a 2-0 lead. Pratt struggled to get things moving in the third set as Butler went up 19-6 to start the set. After a Beaver timeout, the team was able to go on a run of their own, but ultimately lost set three 25-14. Butler won the match 3-0 and the Beavers dropped to 1-3 overall and 1-0 in conference play.

Pratt will take a week to rest and prepare to host #13 Hutchinson Community College (HCC) September 7th. Match is set to begin at 6:30 PM in the Beaver Dome.

## **Beavers Win Against Redlands**



Pratt, Kan. – The Pratt Community College (PCC) Beavers battled the Redlands Community College (RCC) Cougars on Monday, August 22 at the Pratt Soccer Complex. The Beavers picked up their first victory of the 2022 season over the Cougars 3-2.

Action began quickly for the Beavers, as freshman Kaylane Lemos scored the first goal of the game at the 40:48 mark of the first half. Freshman Leticia Tessi was credited with the assist. Tessi didn't waste much time picking up her first goal of season at the 20:30 mark of the first half. Lemos provided the assist. Just four minutes later, Tessi added another goal for a 3-0 Beavers lead.

Redlands scored late in the first half at the 3:09 mark to make it 3-1 at halftime. The Cougars scored the only goal of the second half at the 25:55 mark to pull within one goal of the Beavers. Sophomore Jessi Ferneau had seven saves in the box including two late saves to help lead the Beavers to victory.

In a preseason interview, Coach Ashley Cordeiro had the following to say:

"Last year was an exciting season with a lot of records broken with the most wins and the most goals scored. Coming runner-up again was good, but I feel like there is always room to grow and improve each year. Moving into my sixth season here and with every season going better then the previous we want to continue on that successful path. The goal is to try to do something we have never done before which is to win conference. That is what we have our eyes on this season."

## Men's Soccer Opens Season 1-1-1



Pratt, Kan. – The Pratt Community College (PCC) men's soccer team opened their 2022 season August 26th when they took on the ranked #15 Northern Oklahoma College-Tonkawa (NOC-T) Mavericks.

The Beavers wasted no time in scoring the first goal of their season at the 10:00 minute mark of the 1st half. Freshman Gabriel Dias Juliani scored his first goal in a PCC uniform with sophomore Joao Neves Santos getting the assist. The Mavericks would go on to score five of their own goals (three in the first half and two in the second half) before the Beavers would see another goal. With just 13 minutes left in the game Neves Santos made his first goal of his sophomore season. The Beavers dropped game one 5-2.

On August 27th the Beavers faced off against the Otero College Rattlers from La Junta, CO. The Rattlers struck first in the game, but the Beavers were able to tie the game up at the 56:10 mark off a goal from sophomore Rory O'Conner with an assist by freshman Yuri Ribeiro. The game was called with about 17 minutes remaining due to lighting and ended in a 1-1 tie. Due to the game being over 70 minutes it did count as an official game.

On August 29th the Beavers traveled to McPherson College (MC) to take on their reserve team. The Bulldogs struck first off, a penalty kick within the first minute of the game. Pratt quickly tied the game at 1-1 off a goal from Neves Santos. Freshman Jack Lay was awarded the assist. The game still remained tied at halftime, but the Beavers wasted no time in the second half advancing to a 4-1 win. Their first of the 2022 season. Neves Santos had two goals and both freshman Yushi Nagamatsu and Yuri Ribeiro picked up their first goals in a Beaver uniform.

After playing three games in a four day stretch the Beavers will take a small break as they prepare for Garden City Community College (GCCC) on Wednesday, September 7th. The game will begin at 3:30 pm in Garden City, KS.
