














Also, a donor marquee screen is available as well. Stop by and you will be able to see where Pratt Community College began and where we are presently.







The Student Success Center is located in Dennis Lesh Sports Arena, upstairs, and in office 55. The office is open regular business hours: Monday through Thursday 8am-5pm and Fridays 8am-12pm. In the Student Success Center students have a variety of services available to them. Some of the services include online tutoring, success coaching, counseling referrals, academic advising, testing lab access, case management, follow-up services from academic alerts, test readers, and other academic accommodations. I had the opportunity to speak with Director Diego Esparza and have a Q & a session.

Q: What is the goal of this department?

A: "To help students develop themselves and equip students to handle any obstacles they may face."

Q; What is the importance of connection and community? (Recognizing that this department serves as a bridge between students, faculty, and staff.)

A: The student success center is "A place of belonging for students, a Space where they can be their authentic selves, and A place where they can be vulnerable."
