



Accounting courses allows high school students in 11th and 12th grade to begin their college classes while in high school. In order to earn an Associate of Science (AS) degree in Accounting, students must complete 64 credit hours. Please utilize the College Catalog from our website to validate program/degree requirements. The college courses followed by "online option" notation may be offered as face-to-face and/or online. High school course offerings are not available in all areas.

Cost

Secondary students enrolled in a post-secondary tiered technical course at Pratt Community College will not be charged tuition or general fees. Students will be responsible for book and course fees. Course fees may be charged for designated courses.

Secondary students who enroll in courses that are non-tiered will be charged the current tuition and fees as set by Pratt Community College.

Degree Options

Pratt Community College offers an Associate of Science Degree in Accounting. Students who follow the CTE Accounting/Business Pathway are on track to earn an Associate of Science Degree in Accounting upon completion of additional college credits.

Career Options

The Associate Degree of Science in Accounting prepares the student to work as a para-accountants who works under the supervision of accountants.

The completion of a college/university degree prepares students to work as an accountant (non-CPA) in a public or private office.

Students will need to check the state requirements required to obtain their certification as a Certified Public Accountant.
