PCC Launches New Student Organization

Pratt Community College students, faculty, and staff are working together to launch a new organization to promote school pride, tradition, and enthusiasm within in the institution. The Blue Crew makes its debut in January as students return to an all out "Blue Out" week full of events, contests, and lots of Beaver Blue across campus.

Last year students and staff got together to discuss student activities and events that will promote overall pride and instill enthusiasm throughout the institution. Through these meetings students expressed interest in creating traditions such as homecoming events, inviting local schools to athletic events, and having a "Welcome Back" week that starts the semester with a bang!

The first initiative of the Blue Crew will launch Jan. 12-20 as "Blue Week" will involve student activities, a social media scavenger hunt, chances to win cash prizes, and even writing lyrics for a Pratt Community College Fight Song.

All students and staff are invited to attend all events and show their blue pride. Students who join the Blue Crew during Blue Week will have access to being entered in drawings for cash prizes, free food and drink at athletic events, T-shirts, lanyards, and a membership card.

Student members will be required to maintain an active status by attending events, setting up and cleaning up before and after, promoting future activities, and attending regular meetings. At these meetings students will have the opportunity to help staff plan and implement activities and work within the community to promote PCC.

PCC Hires New Athletic Director

The search for an Athletic Director has come to an end. Pratt Community College has announced that they have hired Bill Wilson as the new Athletic Director.

Wilson is expected to step into his new role in early January bringing a total of 27 years of intercollegiate athletics experience, including 16 years as a college head basketball coach.

Wilson previously served as the Director of Athletics at Northland College in Ashland, Wis. While at Northland College, Wilson developed the addition of men's and women's NCAA golf as well as junior varsity programs in several sports for the college. Wilson was also instrumental in upgrading athletic facilities on campus and developing the college's first athletic booster club.

Wilson is also committed to student excellence and recruiting. He implemented an athletic department recruiting software that worked closely with the college's admissions department in meeting enrollment goals. Wilson established a Student-Athlete Leadership Development program that was a three-phased program that focused on the development of student-athletes academically, socially and communally.

Though the list of credentials and accomplishments is impressive what Wilson truly enjoys is the interaction with coaches and opportunity to witness student athlete growth.

"The most fulfilling part of my job is getting to work with all of the players that I have had and seeing who they have become years later," said Wilson.

Wilson is also excited to make Pratt and PCC his new home. He was drawn to the institution and the athletic program because he is a fan of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference. He enjoys smaller communities and has seen the quality of people that work and matriculate at PCC during his visit.

PCC President Dr. Michael Calvert expressed that he is enthusiastic about having Wilson on board.

"We were blessed with a very competitive group of applicants with three strong candidates in the end. It's a good problem to have and Bill definitely has the experience and knowledge that will be valuable to PCC," said Calvert.

Wilson will be replacing Kurt McAfee as Athletic Director. McAfee is still in the PCC family having accepted the position of Vice President

of Advancement and Alumni Affairs. Calvert said that Bill will bring a fresh set of eyes and a new perspective to the athletic department and has no doubt that he will enhance the athletic programs and bring new opportunities to PCC through his experience.

"Because of his experience I think that he will be a good mentor to our coaching staff and student athletes," said Calvert.

Wilson says that he wants to continue to enhance the department and its programs through efficiency, competition, and a commitment to excellence.

In Wilson's spare time he enjoys traveling, fishing, and aviation. Though at the end of the day his true passion is collegiate sports and working with students.

"This isn't what I do. It's who I am," said Wilson.

PCC Hosts Annual Legislative Luncheon

Pratt Community College administration and trustees sat down with several state representatives and a state senator at a legislative luncheon at PCC on Dec. 14.

Present at the luncheon were Rep. Greg Lewis 113th District (including Pratt County), Rep. Jack Thimesch 114th District, Rep. Ron Ryckman 115th District, Rep. Kyle Hoffman 116th District and Sen. Steve Abrams Dist. 32.

The annual luncheon at PCC is held every year before session begins Jan. 11 of next year. PCC has 5 representatives and 3 senators whose legislative districts touch the PCC service area.

"Funding is always a big issue," said Dr. Michael Calvert, PCC President. "The legislators each shared their views on the upcoming session and felt that higher education funding was important to the training of the workforce and that they

would support at least the current level of higher education funding."

Barret Friend, a non-traditional Electrical Power and Technology student at PCC was also at the meeting. Friend shared with the legislators how PCC has helped him, as one of those who is training for the workforce, to keep up with evolving technology changes in the EPT field.

Former PCC student and current Pratt city electric department director Jamie Huber said success in his career of over 24 years in Pratt was because of his training at PCC.

"I got here because of their leadership," Huber said.

Because of the EPT program at PCC he has hired many students to work for the city.


Ray recently completed an advanced photography class taught by Master Photographer Stan Reimer, who she says constantly challenges and introduces Ray to new ideas and techniques.
