WHAT'S THE PLAN?

STEP 1

Enter at the south entrance of HWY 61 and look for the "Beaver Check-In" sign near the **Welcome tent**.

STEP 2

You will be guided to one of the two check-in stations located in the south parking lot.

STEP 3

Check-in staff will direct you to your residence hall (if financials are complete) or to park and proceed inside if you have incomplete financials.

COVID-19 VACCINE INCENTIVE FOR 2021-2022 ACADEMIC YEAR

\$250 FOR ANY NON-RESIDENCE HALL STUDENT

Pratt Community College will offer the following incentive to students who elect to receive the COVID-19 vaccine and who are fully COVID-19 vaccinated. To receive the incentive, a student must be fully vaccinated* and provide proof of vaccination. Additional terms include:

 Residence hall students - A one-time \$500 incentive for any student enrolled and residing in a campus residence hall. Students living in a residence hall must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester, have paid deposit and completed contract on file.
Non-residence hall student - A one-time \$250 Incentive for any student, not residing in a

2. Non-residence hall student - A one-time \$250 Incentive for any student, not residing in a campus residence hall. No credit hour limit is required.

3. All students who have been fully vaccinated and enrolled and attending in-person classes at any PCC location, including high school locations. *Note: For the purposes of this guidance, people are considered fully vaccinated for COVID-19 \geq 2 weeks after they have received the second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna), or \geq 2 weeks after they have received a single-dose vaccine.

4. The one-time incentive is available throughout the 2021-2022 academic year; including summer 2021, fall 2021 and/or spring 2022 semesters.

5. Students receiving the incentive must be enrolled through 20th day of the semester. If fully vaccinated after the 20th day of the semester but prior to the last day of the semester, the incentive will be available upon receipt and processing of the vaccination documentation in the student's account on the PCC E-Central portal.

6. The incentive will be available to a student upon receipt of proof of COVID-19 vaccination and after the 20th day of the semester; documentation should be submitted through the student's account on the PCC E-Central portal.
