Global Priority

The World Health Organization (WHO) continues to recognize World Mental Health Day on October 10th. The theme this year was set by the World Federation for Mental Health as "make mental health and wellbeing for all a global priority."

Mental health organizations continue to make sure that mental health stands out as an important factor in overall health because mental health problems exist all around us – our personal lives, in the lives of our family or friends, workplaces, communities – and they impact everyone.

We get the chance to talk about mental health in a general communication, how we need and should look at and after it, and how important it is to talk about things and get help when we struggle. This is why WHO and other global organizations utilize the month of October and this specific day to help put a call on global, national, and local government to help make mental health resources a priority.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

For nearly four decades now, the country has recognized October as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. It is a time annually devoted to educating everyone about breast cancer — including metastatic breast cancer (MBC) — and the importance of early detection and access to timely, high-quality care.

No matter who you are or where you live, breast cancer may touch your life. It's necessary to understand the warning signs of breast cancer, your risk of breast cancer and what's normal for you so you can take action if there are any changes in your breasts or underarm areas.

Since 1989, Susan G. Komen has helped drive down mortality rates from breast cancer thanks to our focus on early detection and improvements in treatment. However, that progress may be in jeopardy. During the COVID-19 pandemic, many people delayed their regular breast cancer screening. The pandemic disrupted treatment and research progress.

And more progress is still needed. Through research, growing knowledge about breast cancer has led to new therapies and targeted treatments that improved outcomes for many people. It is research that brings hope to people facing this disease, especially those living with MBC. We need to ensure more treatment options are available for all people facing breast cancer, especially when treatments stop working.

The COVID-19 pandemic also highlighted the inequities in breast cancer treatments for under-resourced communities across the country, as well as the inequity in treatment between Black and white women.

That's why Susan G. Komen encourages you to dedicate this October as a time of action — both for yourself and others.

1 in 8 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime. That's one person every 2 minutes in the U.S.

The two most common risk factors of breast cancer are being born female and getting older.

The Pratt Community College Men's soccer team hosted the Larks of Hesston College on October 1 at the Pratt Soccer Complex.

On what was sophomore day, the Beavers wasted no time taking a quick 3-0 lead and held onto it for the remainder of the game. Sophomores Joao Neves Santos and Rory O'Connor as well as freshman Gustavo Dias Juliani scored in the afternoon's match in front of a packed crowd. Both starting keeper Brandon Bumgarner and sophomore keeper Julian Layne were able to keep a clean sheet.

This year's group of sophomores were recognized before the start of the game. The Beavers advanced to 4-3-2 and 2-2 in conference play. This was back-to-back home conference wins for Pratt after defeating Central Community College-Columbus 3-2 on Saturday, September 24.

The team will travel to Beatrice, NE on Wednesday, October 5 to face the Southeast Storm. The Storm defeated the Beavers 4-2 earlier this season in Pratt.

Beavers Pick up Two Wins During Triangular at Beaver Dome



The Pratt Community College Volleyball team picked up two wins September 30 against Fort Scott Community College and Bethany College (JV). Both wins came as a part of a triangular the team hosted in the Beaver Dome.

The Beavers faced the Greyhounds of Fort Scott Community College to start the afternoon off. In the first set, the Beavers held on to win 25-21, but were unable to hold on to their momentum in the second set losing 25-11. Pratt was able to respond in the third set with a 25-22 win to lead the match 2-1 heading into set four. The team held on to win the match 3-1 with a fourth set victory of 25-22.

Later that evening, the Beavers faced Bethany College (JV) after the Swedes had come back from a 2-0 deficit to defeat Fort Scott 3-2. Pratt wasted no time in the match winning set one 25-7 and set two 25-20 to take a 2-0 lead.

The Swedes were not going to go down easy as they managed to win set three 25-17. With a 2-1 lead, heading into the fourth set, the Beavers decided to not let the Swedes repeat their comeback from earlier in the day and won set four 25-19 to win the match 3-1. Pratt doubled their total wins on the season and now sit at 4-13 overall and 0-7 in the conference as of October 2, 2022.

eSports Competed In NJCAAe Invitational Qualifier



The Pratt Community College eSports team competed in the National Junior College Athletic Association eSports (NJCAAe) Invitational Qualifer Round 1 tournament September 3-4. The team competed in three seperate games including Rocket Leage, Call of Duty: Vanguard, and Super Smash Bros. Ultimate.

The Rocket League team consisting of Dakota Manz, Teagan Seibert and Nathaniel Moore started competition off against the two-time defending NJCAAe Rocket League champions from Lincoln Land Community College (LLCC).

The team lost round one 3-0 against the Loggers, but would recieve a first round bye in the losers bracket and would win in round two against Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College due to a foreit. The faced Heartland Community College in round three of the losers bracket and would end their tournament in a 3-0 loss.

The Call of Duty: Vanguard team consisting of Brandon Roblyer, Luke Schmidt, Waddie Sandford and Dakota Manz kicked off their tournament as the number one seed and recieved a first round bye. In round two, they faced the Blue Dragons from Hutchinson Community College (HCC) and lost 3-0. In the losers bracket, the team faced the University of South Carolina-Sumter (USC-S) and lost 3-0 to end their tournament.

Freshman Matthias Holmes competed in Super Smash Bros. Ultimate and took on a competitor from Salt Lake Community College. Holmes lost his first match of the tournament 3-0. He was scheduled to compete against Coastal Bend College in the first round of the losers bracket, but won due to a forfeit. On the second day of competition, Holmes faced Tallahassee Community College and lost 3-0 to end his tournament.

"It was a tough weekend for the eSports team, but a great learning experience for the level of competition we will face this season," said Head eSports Coach Charles Keefer. "This is the highest level of competition the eSports team has ever competed in and the level our program must get in order to be successful."
