Linda Austin-Landerman - VP Finance and Operations

- Lowered the mill levy and received reductions through the state, actual reduction is close to a million dollars.
- Due to deferred maintenance items that need to be done, funds will need to be taken from reserves or finances. Budget is primary close to the 2024-2025 figures.

Expenditure Budget – Pratt Community College's 2025-2026 expenditure plan reflects a balance between fiscal responsibility and investment in people and programs. Total budgeted expenditure across all funds is projected at \$32,222,935 compared to \$30,873,384 in prior year. The increase supports strategic priorities in deferred maintenance, competitive compensation, and improving institutional aims while target cost-saving measures help offset inflationary pressures.
